Reflection Archbishop Rowan Williams

The Eucharist is not, in Christian practice, a reward for good behaviour; it is the food we need to prevent ourselves from starving as a result of our own self - enclosure and self - absorption, our pride and our forgetfulness. In many of our Churches it was once thought that receiving Holy Communion was something you should only do when you felt you had made "proper" preparation. There was a time in

the nineteenth - century Roman Catholic Church when weekly communion was some thing your confessor might allow you to undertake of he thought you were doing well and there is still, in many parts of the Christian world, a kind of assumption that Holy Communion is something for the holy. All that I have said so far should remind us that

Holy Communion is no kind of reward : it is, like everything about Jesus Christ, a free gift. We take Holy Communion not because we are doing well, but because we are doing badly, not because we have arrived, but because we are travelling.

"You are my friends if you do what I command you." Well, that sounds a bit conditional, doesn't it? You're only my friend if you do what I say. But listen to what Jesus says! He says there's only one commandment which is love each other. Turn from yourself. Recognise

your own distraction, your own being, caught up in ourselves and then you will know what I'm talking about. He's not saying you have to go to church. He's not saying you have to fast. He's not saying you have to obey this or sexual morality, or he's not giving a whole list of rules

and regulations—which of course have been constructed since he gave us this teaching. He's simply saying bring it all down to this one simple thing: pay attention and in that act of attention discover God.

God is present in that act of attention.

Accidental death by drowning of Damien Lucey while swimming in Australia on the 8th January, 2024. Damien Lucy went missing while swimming on the 8th January 2024 in Margaret River, Western Australia. Unfortunately despite valiant search efforts Damien's body was not initially recovered. On July the 5th Damien's remains were found on Honeycomb Beach, Margaret River following a storm, and this allowed his family to bring Damien back to his native home in Ballincollig Co Cork.
