




Quote Thomas Merton

Reflection by Fr Laurence Freeman We should be mindful and set our minds on 'God's kingdom before everything else' (Mt 6:33), not be scattered and jumping from one thing to another all the time. In prayer we must learn to pay attention, to be single-minded, single-pointed, present, still and in prayer, Jesus says also, we should be in the present moment. Not just thinking about this afternoon or tomorrow morning, or anticipating or fantasising what's going to happen next, but to be in the present moment and all of these elements of prayer as Jesus describes them to us are really the elements of the prayer of the heart, contemplative prayer, what we call meditation, Christian meditation.

A Word from Fr Jim

On behalf of Fr Dermot and myself I wish you the peace and joy of the Risen Lord at Easter. Easter is a time when we look forward with joy and hope, even in the face of war,

violence and pain. One of the great joys of this Lent for me has been the growing community of prayer gathering in the

Icon Chapel every morning and evening. May it continue to be blessed.

I write this on Tuesday morning of Holy Week, so I thought I would share some of the insights gleaned from the talk by the poet Aidan Matthews last night.

- Ireland is changing its Gods.

We have emphasised the Gospel of atonement and the Gospel of prosperity. What we need to look at more in the Passion is social exclusion.

-The mob scapegoats Jesus, we can be the mob and the poor and the excluded can quickly be the objects of our rage.

We often believe more in law and order than the peace of the Gospel. When we scapegoat, we point the finger in rage, we look for the fall guy.

- The God of Jesus in the Gospels, is not a king, but a powerless servant.

- Be wary of any sentence that begins with WE (S. Weil)

Easter Sunday, the day of the resurrection teaches us that the future is more important than the past. Let us look to the future with hope. Happy Easter
