What we would like to do is change the world--make it a little simpler for people to feed, clothe, and shelter themselves as God intended them to do and, by fighting for better conditions, by crying out unceasingly for the rights of the workers, the poor, the destitute--the rights of the worthy and the unworthy poor, in other words--we can, to a certain extent, change the world; we can work for the oasis, the little cell of joy and peace in a harried world. We can throw our pebble in the pond and be confident that its ever widening circle will reach around the world. We repeat, there is nothing we can do but love, and, dear God, please enlarge our hearts to love each other, to love our neighbour to love our enemy as our friend."

Reflection by Fr Laurence Freeman

We cannot genuinely meditate without facing the perplexing pains of our world and our personal lives: a medical diagnosis, the loss of a loved one, the birth of a child or falling in love or a large-scale atrocity. These are life changing and so, if we fail to integrate them, we resist the unfolding of life's sacred mystery. If we continued meditating but stayed resistant, in denial or rage, meditation would become an individualistic thing, an escape route, a way to "well-being" rather than the more costly "fullness of life". Meditators in the same community will have different political or moral opinions about the dilemmas of our time. ("A community of faith composed of people of different beliefs".) What they share, deeper than differences, comes from their unity. This bestows the contemplative capacity to face life's challenges and to listen to one other squarely and directly. Wemay disagree on solutions, but we will agree where the hope for healing lies: in the singular point of unity where the ordinary and

the transcendent meet.


We are delighted that Fr Fintan from Glenstal Abbey (ex C.C Balally) has written a new book. It will be launched by Fr Dermot here in Balally
